The Committee met from 4:30-5:30 PM at City of Columbia Offices, 1136 Washington Street, 6th Floor Conference Room

1. Walk Bike Columbia

Lucinda Statler

Lucinda gave an update on several pieces of the Walk Bike Columbia effort:

- Bike Ped counts were completed. Intersections were chosen based on new development, collision history, and access to key transit stops.
- Innovative Design workshop is scheduled for 10/8
- Reviewed public input summary and other documents distributed by Lucinda prior to the meeting: [here](#), [here](#), and [here](#).
- Bike Share Feasibility update – Lucinda explained the different models (least popular was the tourist/Miami model; transportation model was the preference). Potentially working with Leadership Columbia who need a long term project to assess who could start up and maintain the program. - Action goal #6 Cola Town bike Coop; **Michael, Keith**
 - Scott Nuelken working with a graphics designer on a new pamphlet to use as collateral in pitching the need for space.

- Action goal #7 New Construction: **John B, Will, John F**
 - No update.
